SA POLICE ROAD SAFETY CENTRE MILLICENT SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM



A mock roadway is located at the centre and provides a safe environment for participants Wattle Range to become familiar with road signs, pedestrian safety and road rules.

The free school holiday program provides an opportunity for children to gain vital road safety education. Participants in the two-hour program will have a classroom session and a practical session on pedestrian safety and bicycle riding on the mock roadway to put into practice their newly learnt knowledge.

Participants are encouraged to bring their own bicycles and heimets but a range of bicycles designed to cater for all riders and their abilities and heimets will be available for use.

The following two age groups are catered for and the sessions are aimed at children 5 – 8 years and 9 – 12 years. Sessions will be conducted at the Millicert Road Safety Centre, Firth Street Millicent:

Catholic Identity

Holy Week

This week we enter Holy Week, a most solemn week in the Catholic tradition commemorating Jesus' last week on earth and the events leading up to his resurrection on Easter Sunday. Since the earliest centuries of the Church, Christians have made pilgrimages to Jerusalem in order to retrace the steps of Jesus during his suffering, death and resurrection. Around the fifteenth century, Christians began the practice of prayerfully meditating on the Passion of Christ by reproducing that pilgrimage in miniature in what eventually became known as the Stations of the Cross. This week each class have recreated this 'mini pilgrimage' prayerfully reflecting on the Passion of Christ. By walking with Jesus, we join our suffering to His, knowing that He will lead us through it into the new life of the Resurrection.

Prayer

Draw us forth, God of all creation. Draw us forward and away from limited certainty into the immense world of your love. Give us the capacity to even for a moment taste the richness of the feast you give us. Give us the peace to live with uncertainty, with

questions, with doubts.

Help us to experience the resurrection anew with open wonder and an increasing ability to see you in the people of Easter.

The opening of the empty egg and the cracking of the outer 'shell' is much like the opening of the empty tomb, revealing the resurrection of Jesus on the morning of Easter Sunday.
