Professional Learning Days – Student Free

Thursday 8th June and Friday 9th June are Professional Learning Days for staff. These days are extremely important in building the capacity of our staff. This year we will engage in three different areas. Firstly, LEAP levels training (Learning English: Achievement and Proficiency) will support staff in developing their knowledge of the English language, particularly in the area of Writing. Staff will then engage with David Kelly from the Life Buoyancy Institute, with a particular focus on developing our Personal Responsibility and Wellbeing Policy. In this session we aim to elevate the charism and values of our school into a revamped policy that reflects a growth-action approach. Finally, we will revisit our Crossways curriculum work with a reflective session with all three schools on the unit that was collaboratively planned and taught this term. There will be time for moderation across the year levels.

We look forward to these important days as a region to build our capacity as educators.

Counsellor's corner

Whilst our students have greatly benefitted from the advancement of technology in recent years, as parents and care-givers, it can often be a challenge to balance the quantity and regulate the quality of screen time our children are exposed to.

A few helpful tips and guidelines on limiting screen time are:

- Discourage screen time for toddlers under the age of 2.
- We suggest that families decide together on an acceptable amount of screen time with the children in their care. All members of the family will benefit from knowing when and for how long screens can be used or viewed. It is suggested that screen time be limited to a maximum of 1 hour per day.
- Having a communal area in the house (as opposed to children having their device in their rooms) for children to have screen time is beneficial for adults to be able to monitor the time spent on a screen as well as what your child is watching.
- Parents and Caregivers can download helpful applications (apps) to monitor and/or limit screen time usage, as well as to keep an eye on what children are saying via text, searching on internet browsers, or playing online.
- Screens should be turned off at least 1 hour before bed time, as the blue light emitted can hinder sleep effectiveness.
- Participating in screen time activities with the child in your care enables you to monitor the amount of time they spend viewing, as well as who else they are interacting with online (eg online games).
- Have "no-phone-zones" in the house e.g at the dining room table, where the focus is more on uninterrupted family interaction.

By clearly communicating screen time limits and expectations encourages children to self-regulate their own screen time. If you are concerned about the amount of screen time your child is having, are needing support in regulating their screen time, or are becoming concerned about behaviours they present during or after screen time, please contact me and together we can take helpful steps in supporting the child in your care to have a healthy screen time balance.

National Reconciliation Week

As we head into Week 5 we acknowledge National Reconciliation Week. Every day of the year and particularly from May 27 – June 3 is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements and to explore how each of us are able to contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The theme for this year is "Be the voice for generations.'

Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

As a school we spend time learning about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and share history by exploring the Indigenous culture. We thank Aunty Michelle for her visit to our R/1 and 2/3 classes last week. It was a excellent experience for all children and for their understanding that as people of faith, reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians.



Catholic Identity

This week we celebrated a whole school Mass for the Feast Day of Mary, Help of Christians. This feast day is of particular importance to us here in Australia because Our Lady, under the title 'Help of Christians', is a spiritual Patron of Australia, along with St Mary of the Cross. This means that Mary holds a special place for all Australians.

Last week the Church celebrated the Ascension, and this Sunday Pentecost is observed, concluding the liturgical season of Easter.

The Ascension

Even though we can't see Jesus with our eyes, we can always feel His love and presence in our hearts, and we know that one day, we will be with Him in Heaven too.

'No one has ascended into heaven except He who descended from heaven, the Son of Man' – John 3:13

The Ascension is a special event in the Christian faith when Jesus, who had risen from the dead after Easter, went to Heaven to be with God, His Father. It happened 40 days after Easter, and Jesus told His disciples that He would be going to Heaven to be with God but that He would always be with them in their hearts. The Ascension also reminds us that Jesus is in a special place in Heaven, preparing a wonderful place for us to be with Him someday.

Pentecost

Pentecost occurs ten days after the ascension of Jesus. At Pentecost the disciples received the Holy Spirit, and they were filled with joy and courage. They went out into the world to spread the good news about Jesus with everyone. They started to preach and teach about Jesus, and many people became followers of Jesus because of their words and actions. Pentecost is often referred to as the 'birthday of the church' as it marks the start of the disciples building the church upon Jesus teachings.
