
Year 4



We are very excited to continue learning about young Indigenous boy, Nanberry and his experience during the



Dear Families and Friends of Mary MacKillop Memorial School,

A warm welcome back to school as we start Term 3. It has been great to see so many smiling faces and I have enjoyed listening to all that our students got up to in the holidays.

We have certainly enjoyed started the term off with a flourish of activities.

Grandparents and Grandfriends Afternoon

The Grandparents and Granfriends afternoon at school last Friday was a heart-warming gathering, with the House Captains and School Captains leading the festivities. Students gathered in their House Groups - McCormack, Woods MacKillop and Cameron with their Grandparents and Grandfriends for Prayer, led by the students and then participated in various fun activities. Portrait painting was a hit, as was the making of chatterboxes, which many of our special visitors remembered making when they were at school. Afterwards, the children acted as tour guides, showcasing their learning displays and environments. The well-attended event fostered a sense of love and connection among all.

NAPLAN

Last week the Year 3 and Year 5 students received their NAPLAN Results. These results are a snapshot of a student's knowledge in a variety of domains on one particular day. At MMMS staff spend time analysing these results along with PAT (Progressive Assessment Test) testing, classroom assessments, using rubrics and observations to inform their teaching and learning. Our practice is very much individualised for each student so that they have the opportunity to flourish.

However, it is very pleasing to see the continued trend of being above the average mean score when compared with the mean score of Australian schools in the majority of areas. The analysis also helps us to identify the areas that require growth for our students and the areas that we need to focus on to build teachers capacity. Keeping in mind that both cohort of students - Yr 3 and 5 are small, and therefore this impacts the reliability of the data. It does allow us to look closely at individual results and plan accordingly.

Living Learning Leading Survey

I encourage all parents and caregivers to complete the CESA Living Learning Leading Perception Survey, which was distributed to all families on Monday. The survey will remain open until the end of Week 5 and all Catholic Schools in South Australia will complete the CESA LLL Perception Surveys. The surveys, which include both students and staff, result from a collaboration between Catholic Education SA (CESA) and University. They focus on developing, validating, and using system-wide surveys to examine the understanding and implementation of Catholic Education SA's Living Learning Leading Framework in schools, as perceived by students, families, and staff. Each survey has been trailed, refined, and piloted in various CESA school settings. The development team is confident that schools will gain valuable information for planning improvement. At Mary MacKillop Memorial School we highly value family's feedback, to support the school to continuously improve our faith, learning and wellbeing initiatives.

St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop

This coming week, our school community will celebrate the Feast of St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop, one of the most significant dates in our calendar. St. Mary's Feast Day, which falls on Thursday, August 8th, will be marked with a range of special activities. We are thrilled to welcome Andrew Chinn, a renowned Australian religious songwriter and singer, who will join us for the celebrations. Andrew will provide the music for our school Mass, conduct workshops for our students, and conclude the day with a special concert. This celebration of St. Mary, Australia's first saint, promises to be an exciting and reflective experience for our students, offering a chance to honour her remarkable legacy.

Who was Mary MacKillop?

Mary MacKillop, Australia's first saint, was born to Scottish immigrants on January 15, 1842, in Fitzroy, Melbourne. From a young age, her parents instilled in her the importance of good education. At 18, Mary arrived in our town of Penola in 1860. Here, she met Fr Julian Tenison Woods, a remarkable priest and scientist, and together they established her first school, initially holding lessons in a small cottage.

In 1866, Mary set up her first dedicated school in a stable, a site now commemorated as the Mary MacKillop Stable School Park on Queen Street. This marked the true beginning of her vocation. The following year, classes moved to a purpose-built school building, now known as the Woods-MacKillop Schoolhouse, located on the corner of Petticoat Lane. In Penola, Mary also founded the Sisters of St. Joseph with the support of Fr. Woods.

Shortly after the Schoolhouse opened, Mary boarded the steamship SS Penola and travelled to Adelaide, where she established the cathedral Hall School. There, she officially took her vows and became Mary of the Cross. Despite facing numerous trails throughout her life, Mary remained steadfast in her commitment to God's work.

This weekend, I encourage everyone to explore the rich history of Mary MacKillop in our town. We are truly blessed to walk on the same ground that St. Mary did in the mid to late 1800s.

I was unaware at the time, but one young girl was overly intrigued and concerned. The young girl was Elsie Sharbel and she later returned to talk to me at the end of recess.

"No no yet, I'm still looking" I replied.

"Do you like vegemite?" Elsie enquired.

I graciously returned the uneaten half of my vegemite sandwich to Elsie and thanked her for her kindness and that it really meant a lot to me.
