

Memorial of St Vincent de Daul

Vincent de Paul died in Paris on 27th September 1660 at the age of 79. He was canonised on 16th June 1737 and, in 1883, the Church designated him as the special patron of all charitable associations. The society was named after Saint Vincent de Paul and follows along his teachings and compassion for people in need. Saint Vincent de Paul is the international patron of the Society. Wi-Fi is available for visitors to the Mobile Service Centre and staff will be able to help you create a myGov account. myGov is a simple and secure way to access government services online.

Our staff will provide you with friendly face-to-face

service, information and support. From time to time, representatives from other government agencies also travel with the Mobile Service Centres.


