Dear Families and Friends of Mary MacKillop Memorial School,

Welcome to Term 4 - the last term for 2024! This term has been shaping up to be action packed, full of learning and adventures. There are many highlights to look forward to. All families will receive an outline of our end of year celebration dates. We ask that you add these to your personal Calendar.

We look forward to these special occasions with our community. Please also refer to the Term Calendar that was sent home at the end of last term and will be kept updated via Seesaw. Our Year 6s have an exciting term as they conclude their Primary Years of Schooling and set themselves ready for Secondary School. We are so very confident of our group of Year 6s and the success that they will have in the future due to their thorough preparation for secondary school.

New Fee Structure

All families should have received a letter via email and hard copy regarding our new fee structure for 2025 and into the future. Our new fee structure is in response to Catholic Education South Australia's commitment to accessibility for families who choose a Catholic education for their children. Our intent is to ensure that Mary MacKillop Memorial School is a school that is open and accessible for all in our community, as was St Mary of the Cross MacKillop and Fr Julian Tenison Wood's vision. With increases to the cost of living we want to ensure every family in the Penola community still has this choice.

Our new 2025 fee for currently enrolled and new students is \$250 per student. Extracurricular activities, excursions, school camps and uniforms will be charged separately. In addition, we will maintain the Fundraising Levy, \$100 per family.

This new fee structure allows us to eliminate general fees, offering significant savings overall, providing financial benefits for our families.

We acknowledge the support of Catholic Education South Australia and South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools.

Communities of Practice

This Friday the Catholic Schools in the South-East will gather for our Communities of Practice Conference Day. (CoP24). This will be a celebration of collaborative inquiry conducted by teachers in 2024. School Uniform

It has come to our attention that many children are not wearing the correct uniform on the correct day or are wearing a hybrid between the winder and summer and in addition are not wearing the correct shoes.

PE uniform is to be worn on Tuesdays and Thursdays. This includes PE t-shirt, navy trackpants or shorts, rugby top, white socks (no logos) and sneakers appropriate for physical activity.

On the other days, the summer uniform is to be worn. Please refrain from wearing leggings or tights under the summer dress or skort, in addition the skort should not be of PE t-shirt material, it should be the tailored version - available from the front office.

Black school shoes are to be worn when wearing the summer uniform - not sneakers. Please refer to the policy. Please check the policy on earrings, bracelets, rings and necklaces. These are to be plain. Any child wearing jewellery not adhering to our policy will be asked to remove it and place it in a safe place in their bag - sealed envelopes will be available - to take home. (earrings included).

You will receive a uniform reminder note if your child is not in correct uniform.

You are able to find our Uniform Policy on our website, should you need to check. We are currently in the review process of our policy, with a small working party working on our uniform into the future.

I thank you in advance for your cooperation in attending to your child's uniform. The Mary MacKillop uniform is worn with pride.
